A team of Army Officials visited the ICAR-Central Institute for Research on Cattle, Meerut to witness the activities of collaborative project of ICAR-CIRC with the Military Farms located all over India.

The team was led by Lt. Gen. Gopal R., UYSM, AVSM, SM, QMG, IHQ of MoD (Army). Lt. Gen. Gopal R. applauded the MoD and ICAR's collaborative efforts in the development of national breed Frieswal. He also lauded ICAR-CIRC's efforts for disseminating the semen of best ranked bulls to the farmers in different locations in India through the programme like Field Progeny Testing. He assured for availability of the best animals located at different MDFs to ICAR-CIRC so that elite animals may be procured and transferred to Meerut for possible inclusion in elite herds.
